

The Newport Hills Community Association (Phase 2) Board of Directors are adjusting its protocol to accommodate its resident's lap swimming exercise, family pool use, and youth swimming program during the Corona Virus Pandemic.

If we see violations of the RULES, as listed below, it could result in individual homeowner's keys being shut off or full pool closure.

As we navigate further through reopening, and as state and county restrictions change, we will continue to reevaluate the use of the pool amenities.

All rules require a minimum of 6 ft distance from others in accordance with the California state mandate for "social distancing".

The pool or facility/deck is not to be used as a social gathering venue

THERE WILL BE NO LIFEGUARDS ON DUTY

Please stay at home if you:

- Are exhibiting any symptoms of the illness including a fever of 100°F or above, sore throat, runny nose, chills, sneezing, coughing, abdominal pain or diarrhea.
- Have been in contact with someone with COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
- Are a vulnerable individual. A vulnerable individual is an elderly individual and/or an individual with serious underlying health conditions, including high blood pressure, chronic lung disease, diabetes, obesity, asthma and those whose immune system is compromised such as by chemotherapy for cancer and other conditions requiring such therapy.

Pool Hours

- Pool hour restrictions have been lifted and will remain open during normal operating hours of:
 - 5 AM – 8 PM Monday – Friday
 - 5 AM – 6 PM Saturday & Sunday

Age Requirements

Social gathering of any age group is not allowed at this time. Groups of swimmers must maintain social distancing while using the pool.

- 14 and under -only when adult supervision is present
- 14 and over- allowed to swim without an adult present.

If unsupervised young swimmers are not maintaining social distance, they will be asked to leave. This also could result in individual homeowner's keys being shut off and losing pool privileges.

Guest use-

- No guest living outside of the Phase 2 HOA can use the pool at this time.
- NO GUESTS ALLOWED

If we see violations of the RULES, as listed below, it could result in individual homeowner's keys being shut off or full pool closure.

Limited Facility Use: Pool is open for limited use

- Clubhouse/ breezeway is closed
- Showers are closed
- Bathrooms are closed. Public bathroom outside of pool area is available for emergency use
- **Wader pool is OPEN- maintaining social distancing.** No more than 2 families with babies and infants allowed at a time. Time limit of 30 minutes per family for the wader pool if other families are waiting
- Barbecues are closed
- No lifeguards on duty
- All residents are encouraged to carry hand sanitizers and recommended to wear masks while within pool gates and on the deck. Masks must be removed prior to entering the pool.

If we see violations of the RULES, as listed below, it could result in individual NHCA homeowner's keys being shut off or full pool closure.

Temporary Pool Rules

- Time is limited to 1 hour in the pool/ per household.
- If adult is watching a child under the age of 14, they must maintain social distancing from other guardians on deck.
- Come dressed in your suit and ready to swim- changing rooms are not open
- Face Masks required when you can not maintain 6 feet of distance from other patrons
- Please do not share goggles or swim equipment
- No sunbathing, mingling, or socializing outside on the pool deck
- Guardian must maintain social distancing while on pool deck.
- Access to pool will be available to residents only. You MUST have a key to enter the facility. Do not ask the monitor or other patrons to open the door for you. If you happen to forget your key, you must show identification proof of living in Phase 2.
- Do not loan your key out to neighbors or friends.

If you lend your key out to guests, it could result in individual NHCA homeowner's keys being shut off, or full pool closure.

- If you are an owner and need a key, please contact the association office.
- In addition to these above stated rules, all other standard pool rules (posted at entry and near bathrooms) still apply to maintain safety while swimming.

SANITATION SCHEDULE

All High Traffic Touch Points will be cleaned daily.

High Traffic Touch Points include the front and back gates, pool handrails, sink station, and other areas that receiving high traffic.
